FABYAN (FABENS) FAMILY

(1) JOHN FABYAN, had a grant in Portsmouth, NH in 1660. He was a constable in 1678; served on the Grand Jury 1683, 1694-96; on the jury 1688 and 1693. He m. Sarah Hall, daughter of John Hall. Died before 1705 in Portsmouth, NH.

## FROST FAMILY

(1) NICHOLAS FROST (the apprentice), one of the two Nicholas Frosts in the area at the same time. There has been some confusion between the two, but both references seem to have decided the history which follows.

Nicholas Frost was indentured in the City of Bristol England on Mar. 25, 1662 binding him to Thomas Orchard for a term of five years at his arrival in New England. It was agreed that he would provide passage, meat, drink, apparel, and lodging in return for his service and employment. On July 1663, Orchard assigned Nicholas over to William Scadlock for four years. Scadlock lived on the west side of the Saco River near its mouth. Scadlock with Nicholas's consent assigned him to Francis Littlefeild the Elder who lived in Wells, ME. He was a planter and a husbandman. Nicholas took the oath of fidelity to Massachusetts in 1669, and was called a "beaver trader". He married Mary Small, sister of Edward Small. They owned land on the Salmon Falls Brook, which they sold in 1674, and bought land in Upper Eliot.

On June 9, 1693, four persons were carried away from the garrison by Indians and one wounded. The place was Sturgeon Creek. Those carried away were Nicholas Frost's wife and two children and the Widow Smith. Nicholas was captured about the same time. They must have all escaped because he was reported drowned in 1698, and in the same year she was licensed to keep a public house. All their children lived to marry, except Mary. Mary, his wife, must have died about 1712, since on Nov. 26, 1712, administration was granted to "Bartholomew Frost, son of Nicholas Frost, late of Kittery, yoeman, deceased". He was about 28 years old when he came to New England.

Nicholas Frost, born ca. 1634; m. Mary Small; died by drowning in 1698.
