

GOODALE FAMILY

(1) JOHN GOODALE came from Yarmouth, Norfolk County, England in 1638 and settled in Newbury, MA. He came with his wife, widow Elizabeth Taylor, his son Richard and daughters. His wife died in Newbury on April 8, 1647.

Richard came to Newbury with his parents; in 1640 he moved to Salisbury, MA and died there Oct. 1666.

GREGG FAMILY

(1) JAMES GREGG was born in 1690 at Ayrshire, Scotland, and emigrated to the north of Ireland in County Derry in the Parish Muaskee. His ancestors came from Aberdeen. His trade was tailoring and he served as an apprentice before leaving Scotland. He was a linen-draper and a bleacher of linen cloth. He married a Scotch woman, Janet Cargill, daughter of David Cargill. She came from Illa, Scotland. He was about forty years old when he left Ireland and his youngest son was about 10 years old. They came to America in 1718 and landed in Boston, then went up to Casco Bay and spent the winter at Cape Elizabeth. In the spring they came back to Newbury, and joined others who had come from Ireland. They got a township granted to them lying partly west of Newbury about thirty miles, which they called Nutfield. They moved there in 1719. James was one of the proprietors of the town and helped lay it out into lots. He built the first Grist Mill and was commissioned Captain of the first company of militia of the town. He was granted 300 acres of land.

GWILLIM FAMILY

(1) WILLIAM GWILLIM was born in Newtown, Wales. He was the son of David Gwillim and _____ Ingraham. He married Mary Powell daughter of Matthew and Esther Powell.

(2) WILLIAM GWILLIM was born in Newtown, Wales in 1805. He married Elizabeth Griffiths who was born in Guilsfield, Wales on Oct. 31, 1803. Her parents were David Griffiths and Elizabeth Pryce. They married in Wales and came to this country because Elizabeth was told that the only hope for her life would be to come to a different climate. She died in Bristol, CT, where she was living with her daughter, Matilda, on June 2, 1889. She was bothered throughout her life with asthma. She was buried in North Cemetery, Hartford CT, having lived in Bristol, CT for fourteen years. William is said to have been a saddler in Hartford. They lived on Windsor St there. The area in Wales from which they came is a center for the leather industry. He made his declaration for citizenship Mar. 30, 1848; and was naturalized in Hartford County Court on Mar. 30, 1850. He died in West Hartford, CT on May 6, 1864, and is buried in North Cemetery, Hartford CT.

Matilda Mary, born July 17, 1827 in Newtown, Wales, unmarried. Died May 19, 1890.

Pryce Griffiths, born Aug. 11, 1828, in Newtown, Wales; died Sept. 26, 1852 in San Francisco, CA. He died of pneumonia. He had sailed to California to mine for gold. He left a diary of his experiences on the trip.

Anne, born Aug. 28, 1830 in Liverpool, England, died Apr. 27, 1907 in Scranton, PA; married Johnson G. Griswold, Jan. 14, 1850. He was a jeweller in Hartford, CT.

William Robert, born Nov. 29, 1835 in Llandisliva, Wales; died May 7, 1915 in Meriden, CT.

Elizabeth, born Jan. 18, 1833 in Myfod, Wales; died Aug. 3, 1869 in Hartford, CT, m. _____ Buck, a minister.

Reese Barker, born Nov. 29, 1838 in Llandisliva, Wales; died in New York City. He fought in the Civil War and was one of the honor guard for U. S. Grant at his funeral. He was a prominent lawyer in Brooklyn, NY.

Fmmeline Marston, born May 25, 1842 in New York City; died Feb. 18, 1875 in Hartford, CT, m. _____ Kellogg, who was a photographer.

*Thomas Ingraham, born Feb. 6, 1844 in New York City; died in Bristol, CT on Jan. 1, 1916; m. Emma A. Moore.

Caroline Eliza, born May 21, 1846 in New York City, died Jan. 21, 1916 in Dorchester, MA.

(3) THOMAS INGRAHAM GWILLIM, born Feb. 6, 1844 in New York City. The family lived in New York for several years and then moved to Hartford, CT, where Thomas grew up. He was trained as a jeweller by his brother-in-law, J. G. Griswold. He met Emma Moore, who had come to Hartford to work as a sales clerk in a store owned by a Mr. Sawyer, for whom she had worked in Boston, MA. Her mother and father had moved from Standish, ME to Portland, ME, by this time. Through the Methodist Church, Thomas met William Sessions, a prominent manufacturer from Bristol, CT. He convinced Thomas that he should come to Bristol and start a business. He moved to Bristol in the spring of 1875, where he opened a store that sold jewelry, did watch repair, was a travel agent, and sold spectacles. He and Emma were married Nov. 25, 1875 in Cambridgeport, MA at the home of one of her cousins, and then returned to live in Bristol, CT. The store was called Thomas I. Gwillim & Son until he was bought out by his son, Harland Dennett, and the name was changed to the Gwillim Store. He died Jan. 1, 1916, and is buried in West Cemetery in Bristol. His wife lived to be 100 years old, and was the oldest living person in Bristol at the time of her death Jan. 1, 1943. He was active in the Prospect Methodist Church.

Stanley Sessions was born Oct. 16, 1876 in Bristol, CT; he m. (1) Wilhelmina Funck on Apr. 14, 1903, she died Sept. 1920. He m. (2) Edith (Pindar) Taylor of Windsor, Ct on Feb. 4, 1922. He attended Wilbraham Academy and Wesleyan College. He served for three years as 2nd Lieutenant in the Conn. State Guard. He was Secretary, director, and general manager of Trumbull Electric Company in Plainville, CT.
