

HALL FAMILY

(1) SERGT. JOHN HALL, born in England 1617 at St. Micheal Crooked Lane Parish, London, came first to Charlestown, MA. Settled in Greenland in the township of Dover. He was a proprietor of Dover NH in 1642. He became a sargeant by 1649. He was on the Grand Jury in 1664 and 1666. His wife was Elizabeth _____. He was a planter; served as Clerk of the Court in 1663; selectman in 1660; First deacon of the First Church of Dover in 1653. He was the Commissioner to Fnd Small Causes in 1646. He died 1677 or 1687 in Greenland.

HAYWARD FAMILY

(1) NATHANIEL HAYWARD was in Charlestown, MA from May 2, 1649. He moved to Malden, MA. His wife was Sarah _____, and joined the church Sept. 5, 1648. His will was dated May 1, 1680/1. His widow Elizabeth (2?) died May 12, 1686. Her will was dated Mar. 11, 1686. Her first husband apparently was named Oaks.

HILL FAMILY

(1) JOHN HILL, born ca. 1614, came to New England from either Chafcombe-Somerset or Bristol in Gloucestershire, England. He was in Boston Jan. 16, 1656/7. He married Elizabeth Strong, who was either the daughter or sister of Elder John Strong of Windsor, CT. He was a blacksmith or merchant by trade. He was excused from military training in 1661, because of his small stature. He served on the Grand Jury 1668 and 1671. He was in Dover, NH in 1657, settling in Oyster River, now Durham, NH. Last taxed in 1684.

(2) SAMUEL HILL, born 1657 or probably 1659. He married Elizabeth Williams on Oct. 28, 1680. He was licensed to keep a tavern in Oyster River in 1683; he was a bricklayer in Portsmouth, NH in 1703; and a turner in 1705. He also lived in Eliot, NH in 1686. His will was dated Aug. 28, 1713, and probated Mar. 28, 1723.

JACKSON FAMILY

(1) EDWARD JACKSON, a nailer from Whitechapel parish in London, where he lived with his father, Christopher. He was bapt. on Feb. 3, 1604/5 at Stepney. In America, he became a freeman in 1645. In 1646 he purchased a beautiful farm of 500 acres from Gov. Bradstreet for L140, which had been sold to him for six cows by Thomas Mayhew in 1638. He was a representative in 1647, and for 15 years more. He was honored several times for aiding the apostle Eliot in the evangelizing work with the Indians. He died on July 17, 1681 in his 77th or 79th year. He lived in Newton, MA. His first wife was named Frances _____, whom he brought with him from England. Family tradition says that he also brought four sons and four daughters, but only six have been recorded as baptized there at Whitechapel. They are as follows:

Isreal, bapt. Mar. 9, 1631, who died in infancy.

Margaret, bapt. Jan. 1, 1633.

*Hannah, bapt. May 1, 1634, m. John Ward in 1650.

His wife, Frances, died probably on Oct. 5, 1648. His second wife was Elizabeth Newgate, daughter of John Newgate of Boston, widow of John Oliver, by whom he had seven more children.

(2) HANNAH JACKSON, born ca 1634, married ca 1650 John Ward of Newtown, MA. She died on Apr. 24, 1704 in Newtown, MA at the age of 73. John died in Newtown, also on July 8, 1708 at the age of 82.
