George and Mary Hardy. He was a blacksmith and owned and sold
considerable real estate in Newbury, MA, where he lived.

McKEAN (McKEEN) FAMILY

(1) JAMES McKEAN, son of James McKean, was born ca 1665 in Ballymoney, County Antrim, Ireland. He came to New England in 1718. He m. (1) Janet Cochran and (2) Annis Cargil, who died Aug. 8, 1782, age 94. He took an active part in the defense of Londonderry, Ireland. He settled in Londonderry, NH, where he served as Justice of the Peace. He was a man of wealth. He died in Londonderry on Nov. 9, 1756 at age 90/91. He came with the group led by Rev. James MacGregor, who arrived in Boston Aug. 4, 1718. They were a group of Scots who had immigrated to Ireland. They presented a petition to the General Court in Boston for some unappropriated land for a Township. The land was granted and they settled at Nutfield (Londonderry, NH) in April 1719. James was voted moderator for the first town meeting. He was allotted 250 acres by the town. He served a number of capacities in the town government.

MOORE FAMILY

In June 1612, John Moore left home near Glasgow, Scotland, and moved to Country Antrim, North Ireland. He was one of the many encouraged to move there, by the government in hopes of quelling the uprisings in Ireland by sending over staid English and Scottish subjects. His son, James, married Elizabeth _____.

(2) JAMES MOORE, born Sept. 5, 1706 in Lurgan, Ireland. He married Elizabeth Gregg, daughter of James Gregg and Janet Cargill, ca. 1728. She was born ca. 1707. They settled in Nutfield, NH, which later became Londonderry, NH. He died Sept. 30, 1755. Londonderry was settled by a group of Scotch Irish from the general area of Antrim Country. They were given a grant for the unsettled land in New Hampshire. They came with several ministers, who organized the group. They were mostly weavers, who eventually formed the weaving industry in that area. James came here as a teenager, but I am not sure if his parents came with him.

(3) CAPT. HUGH MOORE, born in Londonderry, NH, ca 1742. He married Margaret Nesmith. In 1780, he enlisted in the Continental Army

for three years, credited to Windham, NH. He and his wife moved to Buxton, ME, tradition saying, arrived on horseback the day of the battle of Lexington and Concord. He built a house there, which is now in the town of Standish, ME. On baking day, the Indian women were said to visit to gets samples. Hugh and his son, Jonathan, were instrumental in starting the Methodist church in that area. The first meetings were held in their home, until the church was built. He died Mar. 2, 1814 in Buxton, ME and is buried in the family graveyard on his farm.

NESMITH FAMILY

(1) JAMES NESMITH was born in 1692 in the Valley of the River Bann, Ireland. He married Elizabeth McKean, daughter of James McKean and his first wife Janet Cochran. He came with the group led by Rev. MacGregor, that settled in Nutfield or Londonderry, NH. He was one of the original sixteen settlers. He was married in 1714 before he left Ireland, and had been an elder in the Vest Parish in Londonderry. He died in 1767 age 75; she died 1763 age 67.
